


Saturday, February 1

YOUTH GROUP PLANS ICE HOCKEY EVENT



TRUSTEES DISCUSS ONGOING PROJECTS

The Board of Trustees met Tuesday, January 7, with eight members in attendance. Items discussed included:

- Cross and Flame Project: Painting has been completed by Reverend Hill, and the Cross and Flame has been moved to the church for storage until the weather improves enough to install it.
- LED Lamps: More information is being sought for replacing LED lamps for the various fixtures in the church.
- Building Security: Areas of concern were noted, and work will be done to improve those areas of concern.
- Facility Use Policy: The policy is clearly stated in the church's policy manual and will be
- Upgrade of Audio-Video System. A myriad of possibilities are being explored, including applying for a grant.
- RAN (Renew America's Nonprofits) Grant: The application for this grant to renovate the HVAC system for the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall has been approved and is moving to the second stage of the process.

The Trustees will meet again on Tuesday, February 4, in the Church Parlor at 6pm.

TRUSTEES ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2024

The Trustees always seem to stay busy! Our accomplishments in 2024 include:

- Improving the coverage of the lawn sprinkler system, trimming the shrubbery and removing two failed bushes, resulting in a much-improved appearance of the exterior of the Church.
- Re-activating the French drain along the south side of the Parlor wing which has greatly reduced the potential for flooding in the basement.—Thanks to ALL who helped that workday!
- Running new water and control lines for the sprinkler system to replace those displaced when the French drain was repaired.
- Recaulking the windows and doors at the Parsonage.
- Replacing the flooring in the basement of the Parsonage with ceramic tile.
- Replacing the water lines for the restrooms in the Parlor wing, including adding reliable hot water to those restrooms.
- Replacing the exhaust fan and light in one upstairs restroom.
- Repairing ductwork under the stage to improve the efficiency of the heating system and make Fellowship Hall more comfortable.
- Completing the Cross and Flame for the renovation of the old exterior entry to the Parlor wing.
- As always, the ongoing repair of miscellaneous items at the Church.

Our aspirations for the coming year include:

- Re-activating an abandoned heat duct to supply heat to the office and office entryway.
- Installing the Cross and Flame as soon as the weather permits!
- Upgrading the light and exhaust fan in the second restroom in the Parlor wing. This will be done in conjunction with installing the Cross and Flame due to accessibility of the attic above the restroom.
- Lighting the Cross: We have found a contractor willing to work with us and the manlift necessary to accomplish the work.
- Continuing to work with the Media Ministries Committee to upgrade the audio-video system.
- Installation of heat trace in the gutters at both the Church and Parsonage.
- Converting the fluorescent lights to LED lamps for improved lighting, maintenance and energy efficiency.

Many of these tasks were made possible by the continued generosity of the congregation through the Supplemental Giving Basket. The Trustees thank all who have contributed as we have been able to accomplish much more than usual.
